# Minutes of the February 28th Meeting

21 members present - the meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by Secretary Dan Kittok

Secretary's report - Minutes of the January 31, 2023 meeting were approved as written in the newsletter.

Treasurers report - debits \$13,529.78; credits \$6,250.00; checking balance \$113,828.31. Joe explained that sales tax is required to be filed every month now. Joe talked to our lawyer regarding the back taxes appeal and the lawyer has not heard anything yet.

Trap range update - Mark Bauman updated the club on the new trap range. Mark is searching for concrete contractors. He contacted one company that said they weren't interested in the project and another company never got back to him. If you know of any concrete contractors, let Mark know. The club has hired a consultant to help us with the storm water pollution prevention plan for the new range.

Farm property - The vehicles in the low spot have been removed. There is a wagon that will be removed soon. Joe tore apart a motor home for scrap. He will get a dumpster to put it in. Joe said he will fulfill the rest of last month's motion by May 1st.

4th of July - The fourth of July committee has been meeting monthly. Joe Kittok said that things have been coming together. They have hired the entertainment. There is a plan to replace the beer stand and incorporate the milk shake booth in it. The celebration will be five days this coming year. Joe Kittok is still looking for an assistant to help him. If you are interested contact Joe.

Trap Leagues - Winter league is on their last week of shooting. Summer league will start late April/early May.

Summer raffle - Tickets for the summer raffle are at the printer and will be done soon. Once completed they will be sent out to everyone. An inquiry was made to increase the amount paid to the high ticket seller from \$75 to \$150. A motion was made but it did not get a second so the motion did not pass.

Dave started a petition to stand against a bill that would require registration of every semi automatic firearm and requested club members to sign it.

## **Itasca County Resolution Divides Residents**

From the Star Tribune:

The Itasca county board approved a gun-rights resolution on February 21st, before a packed board meeting. The resolution opposes any new state or federal laws that my infringe on the 2nd Amendment.

What made this divisive in a largely rural county was that the resolution was added to the board's agenda only 2 hours before the meeting. While legal, it's an unusual move for any resolution that is likely to spark debate within the community. The county hasn't said how only supporters of the resolution managed to be aware of the short-notice addi-

tion.

A week later, the meeting was again packed. This time with residents angry that the board did not provide adequate notice. They pointed out that the people of Itasca county said are tired of the government "shoving stuff down Itasca county citizen's throats", but the Itasca county government chose to do the same. Some also spoke against the resolution, but no other action was taken.

Since it's only symbolic, it has no legal bearing on gun rights.

## **Texas Relaxes Concealed Carry Law**

From the Star Tribune:

A Texas court has ruled that the age for a concealed-carry permit (21) is unconstitutional. The appeal by the Texas Department of Public Safety was dropped. Adults 18 and older may now apply for a concealed-carry permit and purchase a handgun as well as a long gun.

Family members from Uvalde have proposed legislation raising the age for long-gun purchases to over 21.

### **2023 TREE PROGRAM**

### Tree Program Participant,

It's that time of year again, as evident by all the emails and phones calls I have been getting, inquiring about this year's program. Well, here it is. New this year we are trying to modernize the program with the use of an online ordering process. This year there is not a paper order form included with this letter, you will have to use the QR code or navigate to the "Tree Store" from our website to place your order. <a href="wrightswcd-tree-sale.square.site/">wrightswcd-tree-sale.square.site/</a> If needed, we can help you navigate the online ordering process at the office. Subsequently, now we will be taking payment when the order is placed. I am sure there will be a few hiccups so bear with us as we navigate the new process.

Throughout the nursery industry, high demand remains for tree/shrub stock. However, growers' capacity and growing conditions in previous seasons dictates the supply. Of course, the continued dry weather has not helped either. Most of our inventory was reserved in August and September 2022 for this spring's program. I was able to secure Tamarack and Hazelnut this year, although the tamarack will likely be smaller than in the past. Consider diversifying your planting plans to build resilience and increase benefits in your landscape. Of course, it is important that the species that you select are appropriate for your planting sites.

Conditions in 2022 seemed to be better overall than 2021 but still not ideal for seedling tree establishment. When you are planting this year, improve resiliency of your new trees by using proper planting techniques, watering, mulching, and weeding around each plant. Hardwood mulch placed in a 1–2 ft diameter around a tree can drastically reduce moisture loss and reduce competition. Remember to keep the mulch away from the stem a few inches to prevent disease. Don't forget tree protection. It's disappointing to go through all that work of planting just to come back to find your trees reduced to stubs. Newly planted deciduous trees and shrubs can be quickly destroyed by browsing mammals like deer and rabbits. Although wildlife benefit from our plantings and may even be our motivation, they tend to devour newly planted trees, especially in early spring as trees are budding and new shouts are tender. Winter can also be detrimental, when bud browsing becomes a main food source. For deciduous trees, tree tubes work great for protection and enhancing growth. For shrubs and evergreens, small wire cages, 1-2 ft in diameter and 4-5 ft tall will do the job. There also are repellent products that can be applied to deter critters, they will likely need multiple applications in a season. Tubes and stakes need to be ordered separately from trees or plants, since the fulfillment process will be different.

The *Native Plant Kits* will continue to be a part of our spring program. For those with limited space, small yards, and garden areas they can add diversity for pollinators, wildlife, and aesthetics. Since our pick-up time is early spring the plants that we receive are usually right out of the greenhouse or dormant from the previous year's stock. The quality of these plants has been great, but it is important to be aware of temperatures before planting outdoors. With a little necessary site prep, the *Native Seed Mixes* are another great option to add or enhance native plants in your landscape. Small native prairie gardens can provide much needed food sources and refugia for birds, pollinators, and other wildlife. Winter seems like it has been extra-long this year, maybe it was the cold maybe it was the clouds and snow. Either way anticipating spring by developing your planting plans is a great activity to get us through this chilly period as the day length slowly increases and we start to see melting. Think about your motivations and priorities as you plan. Do you want pollinator and wildlife habitat, property borders or fruit tree? Do you have priority areas? We continue to provide a variety of MN native and adapted species. We like to switch it up every year to meet demand and provide different options for returning planters. If there are species that you would like to see on the list next year, let me know. As always, we are here to help. Give us a call if you have any questions.

- Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
- 4. No Paintball guns
- 5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
- 7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
- 8. Do not dig in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 vards.
- 10. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in use.
- 11. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 12. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
- 13. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
- 14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
- 15. Do a **Safety Check** before firing
- 16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden
- 17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.
