# Volunteer Credit– What Counts?

Members who volunteer to support the club receive reduced dues of \$50 for the next year. So, what counts?

Hours: 8 hours of time will give you credit to reduce your dues to \$50. So, if you work one 4-hour shift at July 4th, you still need to volunteer 4 more hours...or you and a family member could both volunteer, or you could volunteer for two shifts.

Meeting Lunch: If you make lunch for the members, your groceries (up to \$150) is reimbursed, and you get full credit for volunteer time.

Raffle Tickets: If you sell 20 books of raffle tickets, that meets your full volunteer requirement.

# **Minutes of the August 29th Meeting**

29 members present - the meeting called to order at 7:03 PM by President Tom Delaney

Secretary's report - Minutes of the July 25, 2023 meeting were approved as written in the newsletter.

Treasurers report - debits \$50,554.34; credits \$6279.00; checking balance \$10,610.20 - was approved

Trap range update - Mark Bauman and Tom Delaney spoke with Excel Energy on how to get electricity to the site. There are two options: Excel would run electricity to a pole they would put on site for a cost of \$5400. The club would then need to run wire from the pole to our box to hook up . Or, Excel would trench underground electric service to our box for a cost of \$6700. A motion was made and passed to go with the underground electric service option. This will take place in November. Mark Bauman has purchased wiring and supplies for the light poles . The next step is to get the concrete pads poured for the lights and trench wire to each location.

Mark Bauman will talk to John Fritz to get an estimate of where we are at with gravel loads going in and out of the property.

25 Yard Range - The range continues to have its portable targets misused and damaged.

Newsletter - A discussion was had regarding the clubs newsletter. There are still about 140 members who get their newsletter mailed to them at a cost to the club of about \$235.00 per month. The club would like to have as many people as possible get their newsletter by email. It was decided to put a note in the envelopes of the next newsletter mailing indicating that we would like to switch everyone to email. If you continue to need the newsletter mailed contact the club and it will continue. If the club is not contacted with an email address or an indication it needs to be mailed the mailed newsletter will be cut off to that person in January.

4th of July - The celebration was a big success. The club received its share of the profits - \$14,000 this year. Next year the celebration will be four days. It takes 156 volunteers for the club to cover all shifts in the bingo stand and milk shake booth.

Summer raffle - The summer raffle has collected around \$4190.00 so far. See Jan Kittok if you need more tickets to sell.

Membership - The club has 656 total members, 19 members are already paid for 2024.

Women's League - The Women's league will meet on Tuesday September 19th for their trapshooting event. In October they will have a classroom session. If you are interested in joining the Women's League contact Ann Finelli. Joe Kittok and Tom Delaney met with the bank to renew the loan on the clubs property. The payment went up a bit. The loan will be paid off in 10 years. The bank evaluated the property at \$800,000.

Club sign - Tom and Mike will look for a suitable spot to put it up. It was suggested to buy one more sign for the club.

Volunteers - We need more volunteers in the club for clean ups, lunches etc. A list will be posted of volunteer opportunities.

Muzzleloader interest - Club member Joe Bergeron is looking to put together a muzzleloader group and bring back muzzleloading events to the club. He would like to do an instructional class before the deer season.

The club received a thank you note from Fishing Klinic for Kids for our continued support. The club also received a packet of thank you letters from kids that have taken their gun safety training through Three Rivers Park Disitrict and used the club for their range day.

Annual Turkey Shoot - The clubs annual turkey shoot will be held on Saturday, September 9th from 9:00 - 11:00 am with a chicken dinner to follow. Volunteers are needed for this event.

Non-Member sight in day will be held on October 14th. Spread the word regarding the event to get more people involved. \$350 is needed for advertising and supplies. A motion was made and passed to approve \$350 for the event.

Sunday, September 10th there will be a clean up day at the farm. Meet at the farm at 9:00 AM.

Thank you to Mike Larison for providing lunch for the meeting. The club is looking for volunteers to do lunch each month. Contact Mike Larison if you are interested. Going forward if we do not have a volunteer for lunch, then lunch will not be provided for that meeting.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 PM.

### Range Rules:

- 1. You must wear your ID card when on the range.
- 2. Maximum of 2 guests per member are allowed.
- 3. Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
- 4. No Paintball guns
- 5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
- 7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
- 8. Do not dig in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 yards.
- 10. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in use.
- 11. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 12. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
- 13. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
- 14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
- 15. Do a **Safety Check** before firing
- 16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden
- 17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.
