MINUTES OF THE JULY 30, 2024 MEETING

23 members present - the meeting called to order at 6:59 PM by President Mike Larison

- Secretary's report Minutes of the June 25, 2024 meeting were approved.
- Treasurers report debits \$3708.03; credits \$1715.00; checking balance \$1719.30 Trapshooting Checking: debits \$1318.55; credits \$11,106.13; checking balance \$14,436.94.
- New members Two new members introduce themselves.
- Membership There are 590 paid members, 2 lifetime members and 83 honorary members. Two members have paid for 2025 already.
- Building and Grounds The county fixed the driveway going down to the trap shack with asphalt millings taken from County Road 50. Lights in the clubhouse need to be fixed.
- 4th of July -A meeting was held a week ago. The celebration was a success. The bingo stand made as much this year as it did last year. The celebration brought in \$470,000 before expenses. The club will get \$8600.00
- Summer Trapshooting The leagues have completed 12 weeks of the 18 week season. Clay pigeons need to be purchased for the league. The order will be 12 pallets of pigeons for around \$13,000.00 which will last about a year. A motion was made and passed to order the pigeons.
- Summer Raffle \$2695 has been collected so far. Contact Jan if you need more tickets.
- Range Orientations have been given to all new members joining the club. It is working out well.
- Women's League The Women's league held an event in July, however it was a small group that attended. Hopefully the August event will be better attended.
- Bylaws The bylaws allow for up to \$250.00 to be spent without club approval. Due to the current financial situation Mike would like to temporarily lower it to \$150.00. It was discussed to suspend the cleaning service for a few months and use volunteers to save additional money.
- Republic Recycling and Trash service The recycling container had 3 plastic garbage bags in it this last month. As a result the club was charged \$300.00 as no plastic bags are allowed in the recycling container. Mike contacted Republic and got the fee cut in half. The club would like signs made up indicating what is allowed to be thrown in the container. It was also discussed to lock the container, but it was decide to try the sign option first.
- Volunteer opportunities Mike Larison asked for help on Saturday or Sunday to create the new pad for the Porta Biff and to move the telephone poles on the 25 yard range. The club has a member that would trim the maple tree in front of the clubhouse but it would require a lift to be rented. Due to finances the club will wait on trimming the tree. The Volunteers Needed email that was sent out in late June was a huge success. A lot of participation was generated as a result. Mike will continue to do this monthly. The Sign Up Genius for meeting meals also worked well. Volunteers have signed up for meeting meals through the end of the year.
- Club Dues Mike will be sending out an email to see if members will pay their dues early and/or pay an additional donation to help the club. A discussion was had on how to handle dues for new members joining in the middle of the year. Should there be half year memberships? After input from the club and new club members that were in attendance it was determined to keep the dues at full payment

for those joining midyear. However, if joining after November 1st, the new member would get the remaining two months included in the yearly membership.

- High School Trap Team Coach Jeff Graunke of the Delano High School trap team presented the club with a check for \$1700.00 to be used for a voice activated throwing system on the new trap range. The kids sold fish fry tickets to the Delano Legion Club fish fry earlier in the year to raise the money. It was the largest fish fry the Legion has ever had. There were 81 kids on the team this past year.
- Turkey Shoot The club's annual turkey shoot will be on Saturday, September 21st this year. Ann Finneli mentioned that it should be posted in the newsletter that a group will be needed to clean up the clubhouse the day before the event.
- Taste of Delano The Taste of Delano will be held on Wednesday August 7th. The club gives out ice cream cones at this event. A motion was made and passed to purchase the supplies for this event.
- New Trap Range The shed was moved to the new trap range. A volunteer will paint it. Additional work will need to be done on it to make it useable. Winter league will continue to operate out of the existing trap shack for this coming winter.
- Trap Range Completion & DNR Grant Mike Larison and Dan Kittok met with the banker to get a line of credit to be used for completion of the third trap range. The meeting went well. The bank required some additional information before approving. That information has been provided and it should be no problem getting approved.
- Trap Range Clubhouse fundraising Jeff Graunke is willing to take the lead on fundraising for the new trap range clubhouse. Tim Lemmerman said he would help as well. A CUP for the structure has already been approved and blueprints have been made. The main structure would be 24' X 40'. A question was brought up if the club could become 501C3 so that donations could be tax deductible? This will be looked into. A motion was made and passed to have Jeff start the fundraising process.
- EAW on property No additional news. The permitting is still being worked on.
- Farm Rent Joe Kittok provided the club with documentation of work provided to offset the rent. Fifty two hours were documented for July. The document was passed around to the club members for comment. One comment was made that all the work hours documented would be considered volunteer hours. It was also brought up that Jans hours should be included in the agreement.
- Farm Clean-up Joe updated the club that he continues to move more items into the sheds and on to trailers. This led to a discussion that more still needs to be done. The club continues to get comments from the township and individuals regarding how the property looks. Joe would like to meet with one person to tell him what more needs to be cleaned up. Mike Larison will be working with Joe on this.

Rifle and Pistol:

Monday-Friday: 8:30am-SUNSET Saturday: 9:00am-6pm Sunday: 11:00am-6pm

Rifle and Pistol Ranges are closed during Trap Shooting events, leagues and practices. Watch the range calendar for restrictions/closures due to scheduled events.

Trap Shooting:

No Hand or portable throwers allowed.

League and Practice Hours: Wednesday & Thursday: 5:45pm-10:00pm

Trap Shooting is only allowed during scheduled events and practice time.

Don't forget to wear your ID. See someone without an ID? Ask to see it...

Be kind to our neighbors- follow the rules!

Range Rules:

- 1. You must wear your ID card when on the range.
- 2. Maximum of 2 guests per member are allowed.
- 3. Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
- 4. No Paintball guns.
- 5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
- 7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
- 8. Do not dig in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 yards.
- 10. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in use.
- 11. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 12. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
- 13. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
- 14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
- 15. Do a Safety Check before firing.
- 16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden.
- 17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.
