VOLUNTEER CREDIT - WHAT COUNTS?

MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER 26, 2024 MEETING

30 members present - the meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by President Mike Larison

- Secretary's report - Minutes of the October 29, 2024 meeting were approved.
- Treasurers report - debits \$9004.98; credits \$7300.00; checking balance \$12,071.69 - Trapshooting Checking: debits none; credits \$.09; checking balance \$2166.58. Capital Savings account for new trap clubhouse: debits none; credits \$3200.00; balance \$31,680.01 All reports were approved.
- New members - One new member introduced himself.
- Membership - There are 120 members paid through 2025, 2 lifetime members and 88 honorary members.
- Building and Grounds - Thank you to everyone who helped clean the clubhouse, it looks great. The trap shack has been open for two weeks now. Basic rules for using it have been posted. The heat is set at 56 degrees for range users to use as a warming house or prep for shooting.
- 4th of July -More food wagons and outside vendors are being discussed for next year. The contract with the carnival is still being written to see what the carnival will allow.
- Trapshooting league - Winter league will start on Thursday, December 5th.
- Member raffle - \$1480.00 has been collected so far.
- Legislative report - Dave Smith updated the club on legislative issues. Binary triggers and straw buyers were discussed as it relates to Minnesota.
- Range -The portable targets are getting shot up, otherwise minimal issues.
- Women's League - The league will be taking a break until January 2025.
- Range/Clubhouse reservations - Range dates for The Womens Group, West Metro, Three Rivers Park and West Hennepin police were all approved. Dates for the clubhouse and range for youth firearms safety training were approved.
- Executive Board meeting - There will be an Executive Board meeting after the regular meeting in January to discuss upcoming club projects and improvements.
- Back-ups for President, Secretary, Treasurer and Membership - A discussion was had on the pos-

- sibility of having a back-up person for the roles of President, Secretary, Treasurer and Membership. After some discussion it was suggested to put a notice in the newsletter to see if there are any members interested in those roles. There will be further discussion on this in the future.
- Hunting on the farm property - People have asked to hunt on the farm property. The club does not allow hunting on the property.
- Christmas Party -The club Christmas party will be held on Friday, December 13th from 5:00 - 9:00 PM. The club is looking for donations for Christmas gifts.
- Gun Show - The clubs annual gun show will be held on Saturday, January 11, 2025 from 11:00 am - 3:00 pm.
- Trap Range Expansion & DNR Grant - Concrete on the third range has been poured. Wiring for the lights is being worked on. Doors on the final thrower have been installed.
- Trap Range Clubhouse update - Preliminary drawings are in front of engineering at Worldwide Steel Buildings. Final drawings should be completed next week. These drawings will allow the club to proceed with the permitting process necessary to start building.
- Non Member sight in day - Nine adults and 3 youths participated. Fourteen guns were sighted in.
- Big Buck Contest - The Sportsmen's club Big Buck contest is going on. Send in your photos! There will be a prize for best adult member photo and best kid/family photo.
- Club Audit - The audit of the clubs general checking account is ongoing.
- EAW on property - No additional news. The permitting is still being worked on.

Thank you to everyone who brought food for the wild game feed. Moose, venison, wild turkey and fish were all part of the menu as well as many desserts. The January meal will be provided by the Lucky Fives trapshooting team.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:29 PM.

Rifle and Pistol Ranges are closed during Trap Shooting events, leagues and practices. Watch the range calendar for restrictions/closures due to scheduled events.

Trap Shooting:

No Hand or portable throwers allowed.

League and Practice Hours:

Wednesday & Thursday: 5:45pm-10:00pm

Trap Shooting is only allowed during scheduled events and practice time.

Don't forget to wear your ID.

See someone without an ID? Ask to see it...

Be kind to our neighbors— follow the rules!

Range Rules:

1. You must wear your ID card when on the range.
2. Maximum of 2 guests per member are allowed.
3. Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
4. No Paintball guns.
5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
8. Do not dig in the backstops.
9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 yards.
10. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in use.
11. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
12. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
13. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
15. Do a Safety Check before firing.
16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden.
17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.

Mr. Big, by Harold and son Joe Menk

My son, Joe, has 40 acres in Central Minnesota, on which he has developed a number of quality food plots and deer stands. He and I built one of the stands together, which we call the wood shed stand. It was an enjoyable father-son project that I think we will both always remember. A large buck was criss-crossing the Joe's property all fall, but he had never gotten a decent chance at the phantom monarch until a few weeks ago. One afternoon late in the muzzle-loader season he took to the wood shed stand armed with one of the family smoke poles...a Thompson Center Bone Collector 50 caliber mounted with a zero mag scope dating way back to the days when you had to have a note from your optometrist to get cross hairs. As told in his own words, Joe finishes the story of what happened when that big bruiser stepped into the clearing:

As the final minutes of legal shooting light slipped away, I caught movement near the edge of the clover plot. Instinctively, I raised my binoculars. There he was—the buck I'd been chasing for three long months. My heart quickened as I recognized his broad frame and unmistakable rack. He was on the move, trotting steadily, already halfway through my shooting lane by the time I steadied my muzzleloader and found him in the scope.

There wasn't much time to think, only to act. As he neared the thick cover on the far side of the plot, I centered the crosshairs on his shoulder and squeezed the trigger. The shot rang out sharp and true, and the big buck went down. In those electrifying moments, three months of effort, frustration, and hope came crashing down on me. Adrenaline surged, followed swiftly by a wave of raw emotion. I sat there for a moment, soaking it all in, before collecting myself and heading back to the house.

My wife and two boys were already waiting at the door, excitement on their faces—they'd heard the shot. Together, we set out for the recovery, my trusty ice fishing sled pressed into service to haul the massive 10-point buck back home. It was a memory we'll all cherish, the kind of moment that makes a season unforgettable.

Looking back, it was a perfect way to cap off a hard-fought season. Earlier in the year, I'd taken two does with the crossbow and passed on at least six smaller bucks, holding out for the one my Dad dubbed "Mr. Big." As the days wore on and the season dwindled, doubts crept in. Was I being too picky? Should I have taken one of those other decent bucks that crossed my path?

But in the end, patience and persistence paid off. That final evening in the stand proved what every hunter knows deep down: sometimes, the hunt isn't just about the harvest. It's about the chase, the memories made, and the satisfaction of seeing it all come together at just the right moment.

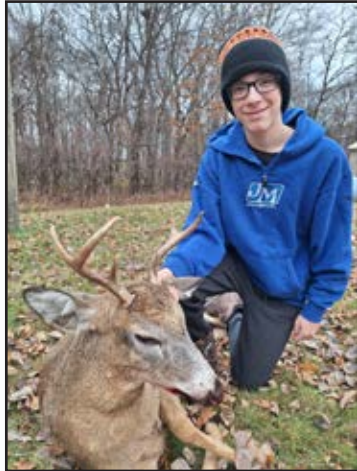

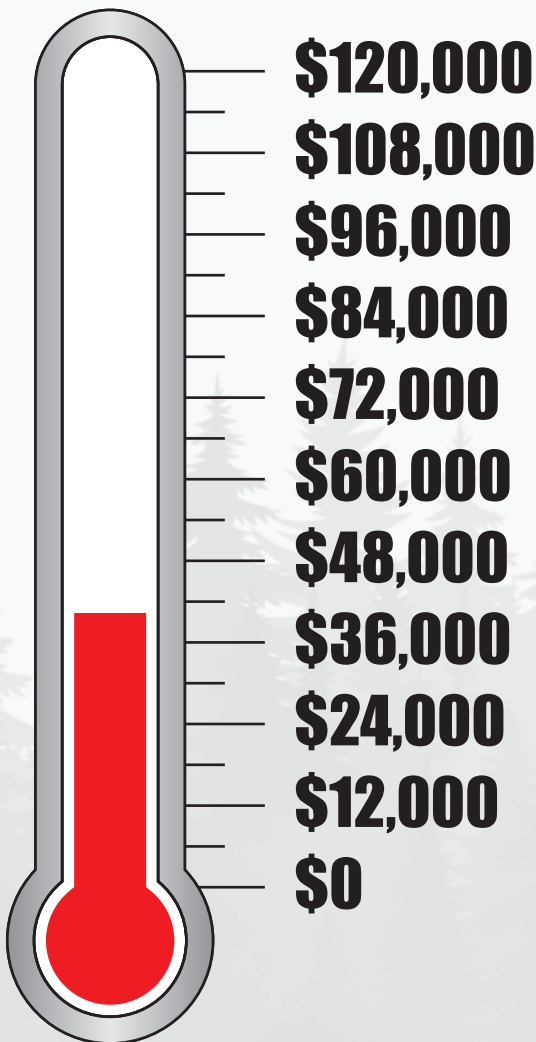


DELANO SPORTSMEN'S CLUB NEW CLUBHOUSE FUNDRAISING



The Delano Sportsmen's Club is building a clubhouse on the new trap range. *This project will be funded solely by donations from individuals and businesses from our community, which is why we're asking for your help.*

GOAL



We're currently working with club member Jon DeWitte from **Worldwide Steel Buildings** on a structure that his company has discounted to the club. **Our goal is to build a quality structure that we will be proud of and be cost efficient doing it.** The clubhouse will be 24'x40' with a 24'x32' covered patio area. Our Phase 1 goal was to reach \$40,000 by the end of October so we can pour concrete this fall – **we've reached that goal!** Phase 2 will be for materials and labor to put up the Clubhouse exterior shell at a cost of approximately \$80,000. We would like to purchase the materials by January so we can put it up this winter/spring. Phase 3 will be to finish off the inside of the clubhouse – **as we could use members who want to volunteer to help**, the cost of that final Phase is TBD.

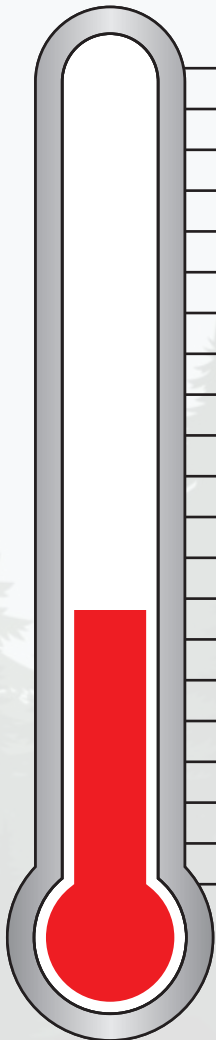
