### **MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 28, 2025 MEETING**

34 members present - the meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by President Mike Larison

- Secretary's report Minutes of the November 26, 2024 meeting were approved.
- Treasurers report debits \$5676.36; credits \$10,300; checking balance \$37,734.55 Trapshooting Checking: debits \$5550.47; credits \$14,360; checking balance \$10,976.87. Capital Savings account for new trap clubhouse: debits none; credits \$15.96; balance \$31,695.97 All reports were approved.
- New members Three new members introduced themselves.
- Membership There are 385 members paid through 2025,
   2 lifetime members and 89 honorary members. 174 members have not yet paid.
- Election of Officers Dan Kittok was nominated for Treasurer. There being no other nominations, Dan Kittok was voted in as Treasurer. Dan Kittok was nominated for Secretary. There being no other nominations, Dan Kittok voted in as Secretary. Mike Larison was nominated for President. There being no other nominations, Mike Larison was voted in as President. The current First, Second and Third Vice Presidents all elected to stay on and were voted back in.
- Volunteers Mike would like to start a volunteer committee. If anybody would like to help out on the committee, let Mike know.
- 4th of July -Meetings are being held monthly. They are
  planning for both 2025 and 2026. They had an offer from
  a company that would do a drone show one night of the
  celebration. The offer is still being discussed. More food
  wagons and outside vendors are being discussed for next
  year.
- 4th of July Bingo stand Jan has the signup sheet for bingo shifts.
- Trapshooting league Winter league is in its sixth week of ten.
- Member raffle \$2390.00 was collected. The winner was Brad Majorino
- Reservations Reservations for the Boy Scouts for March 28, 29, and 30th - Rockford firearms safety for April 26th and a Black Powder class for April 27th were all approved.
- Christmas Party The Club's Christmas party in December had a great turn out.
- Gun Show The gun show that was held on January 11th went very well. There were over \$1 million in guns displayed. It had a good turnout. The gun show is held every year on the second Saturday in January
- Women's League There will be an event on Saturday from 11:15 3:00 PM.
- Summer Camp It was approved to send up to 10 kids to summer camp this year. Either Deep Portage or Three Rivers Park District Forkhorn camp. Six kids are signed up already. The cost to the club is about \$400 for each kid.
- Storage room Tom Delaney and Gene Hanson went through and cleaned the storage room upstairs. There is leftover items that can be taken if anyone is interested.

- Chamber of Commerce Tom Delaney will be joining the Rockford Chamber of Commerce and asked to represent the club there as well. Permission was given to Tom to represent the club there.
- Summer Raffle A discussion was had on changing the requirements for the number of ticket books sold to qualify for volunteer hours. A motion was made and approved to change to: 20 books sold now qualify as 5 hours and 40 books sold qualify as 10 hours of volunteer time. Tickets for the summer raffle will be mailed out in late February.
- Police Officer dues A discussion was had on increasing the dues to the Police officers. After a lengthy discussion of points both for and against doing this, a motion was made to increase the Police officer dues from \$50.00 to \$100.00. It was then amended to include an effective date of 2026. Motion was passed. Mike Larison will reach out to the departments to inform and explain to them the reasoning.
- Gun Owners Caucus Rally There will be a gun owners rally again at the Capitol on Saturday, March 29th from 11:30 1:00 PM. The club would like to get a bus again to go down to the rally. Please let Tom Delaney know if you want to go.
- Bird House building It was approved to make 30 wood duck houses and 30 bluebird houses again this year. We will be assembling them on Saturday, April 12th. Time yet to be determined.
- Trap Range Expansion & DNR Grant Everything has been completed to satisfy the DNR Grant requirements. The check was received in December and applied to the loan. The loan will now go from interest only to a loan payment.
- EAW John is still working on the EAW. Per the clubs agreement with John, he has use of the land and may want to farm it this year.
- Trap Range Clubhouse update Jeff Graunke gave an update on the progress. He is working with American Mechanical to get a plumbing drawing made to send to the State of MN for approval. It could be submitted as early as tomorrow and will take 30 60 days to get approved. Once approved information can be submitted for the building permit
- Delano High School trap team Coach Graunke said that there will be a sign up meeting soon for the Delano High School trap team. Last year they had 81 kids participate. There are a lot of new kids interested in participating again this year.
- Big Buck Contest Three adult photos and four youth photos were submitted.
- Club Audit The audit of the clubs general checking account is nearly completed.

Thank you to the Lucky Fives trapshooting team for providing the January meal. February's meal will be provided by Coborns.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:55 PM.

A Firearms Safety class is held at the club every spring. Registration for this year's course is on Monday, March 17 from 7-8pm at the Clubhouse. The Firearm Safety course is now required by the State of Minnesota. The club has offered this course since 1955. The course is based on gun safety and handling of a firearm, hunter responsibility, ethics and game identification, plus many other areas. More info later in this newsletter!

Saturday: 9:00am-6pm Sunday: 11:00am-6pm

Rifle and Pistol Ranges are closed during Trap Shooting events, leagues and practices. Watch the range calendar for restrictions/closures due to scheduled events.

#### **Trap Shooting:**

No Hand or portable throwers allowed.

League and Practice Hours: Wednesday & Thursday: 5:45pm-10:00pm

Trap Shooting is only allowed during scheduled events and practice time.

Don't forget to wear your ID. See someone without an ID? Ask to see it...

Be kind to our neighbors-follow the rules!

#### Range Rules:

- 1. You must wear your ID card when on the range.
- 2. Maximum of 2 guests per member are allowed.
- 3. Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
- 4. No Paintball guns.
- 5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
- 7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
- 8. Do not dig in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 yards.
- 10. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in use.
- 11. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 12. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
- 13. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
- 14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
- 15. Do a Safety Check before firing.
- 16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden.
- 17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.

### FIREARMS SAFETY TRAINING COURSE

## Delano Sportsmen's Club

## March 18th - April 12th, 2025

Location: Delano Sportsmen's Clubhouse

Registration date is March  $17^{\rm th}$  from 7-8 pm at the Delano Sportsmen's Club. A parent or guardian is required to register each student.

Course is 4 weeks in length – held Tuesday and Thursday evenings except for March 24<sup>th</sup> which is held on a Monday evening.

Class Dates and Times are as follows:

March 18 & 20 7-9 pm

March 24 & 27 7-9 pm

April 1 & 3 7-9 pm

April 8 & April 10 7-9 pm

April 12 Field Day 7 am- 1pm

Students must be 11 years old by class start date. Adults are welcome and encouraged to take this course.

A parent or guardian is requested to attend the first class on March 18st.

There is no course fee.

No firearms or ammunition are to be brought to classes by students. A firearm of some type (i.e., rifle, shotgun, BB gun, etc.... but not pistol) will be needed for the Field Day and each student is encouraged to bring their own. If student cannot bring a firearm, one will be provided to use on Field Day. Do not bring ammunition to Field Day, the instructors will provide ammunition for students .22 rifles. Only .22 caliber will be permitted for firing on Field Day.

Field Day will be held rain, snow, or shine. Students should dress accordingly.

This Firearms Safety Training Course will cover hunter responsibility, firearm handling, marksmanship, wildlife identification, game management, conservation, game care, outdoor survival, water safety, and first aid awareness.

Students successfully completing this course are eligible for their Minnesota Firearm Safety Certificate.




