

# Mandatory CWD testing – Firearm Season Opening Weekends

During the opening weekends of the 2018 firearms statewide A and Late Southeast 3B deer seasons, Nov. 3 – 4 and 17 - 18, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources will require hunters in all or parts of 16 deer permit areas (DPAs) to submit lymph node samples from adult deer harvested from the permit areas listed in the table. These DPAs are located in southeast Minnesota, near where several captive and wild deer have tested positive for Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD), and in central and north-central Minnesota in areas near where deer in captive deer tested positive.

North Central - 242 and 247

Central
219 south of Highway 55
277 and 283 east of Highway 4
285 north of Highway 7

Southeast - 255, 341, 342, 343, 344, 345, 346, 347, 348, 349

DNR will staff 35 conveniently located sampling stations spread out over these DPAs from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., Nov. 3 – 4 and 23 locations on Nov. 17 – 18 (3B season). Samples gathered by DNR will be submitted for testing in a laboratory. Precautionary disease testing for should allow DNR to quickly respond and limit the spread of CWD if any positive deer are found.

#### Range Rules:

- 1. You must wear your ID card when on the range.
- 2. Maximum of 3 guests per member are allowed.
- 3. Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
- 4. No Paintball guns
- 5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
- 7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
- 8. Do not dig in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 yards. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in
- 10. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 11. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
- 12. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
- 13. No human silhouette targets, except official **police events**.
- 14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
- 15. Do a **Safety Check** before firing
- 16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden
- 17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.
