43 members present - the meeting called to order at 7:01 PM by President Tom Delaney

Beyond that, we discussed thinking and planning ahead for emergencies at the range (good idea to call for cease fire in a medical emergency so you have extra hands to flag in responders or help provide aid), as well as the challenges to having a range first aid bag or AED in a range that is usually unsupervised (no way to store it without freezing).

For those interested, the most basic things you should have with you for a first aid kit are:

- Clotting Agent (QuikClot®)
- Tourniquets (1 ea.)
- EMT Shears
- Cravats (3 ea.)
- Bandages (4"x4"/6"x6")
- Nitrile gloves
- Roller gauze
- Cloth Tape

For Clotting agent, there are a lot out there. Quick- $Clot^{TM}$ has been around the longest, but there are a number of brands out there.

While you can make a tourniquet using either a cravat or roller gauze, a commercial tourniquet is faster to apply and secure. Again, there are a number out there. The CAT (Combat Application Tourniquet) is popular, and has a number of knock-offs. They're designed to apply with one hand if necessary.

EMT scissors are handy for a lot of stuff (first aid and otherwise). Good to keep handy.

All of this will fit in a fairly small bag, so it doesn't take up a lot of space.

We'll plan another first aid round table next year, and I'll throw in some more articles on basic field first aid when there's space available.

Oh, and next year, that arterial bleed will be back on the BIG SCREEN!

No monthly club meeting in December

Range Rules:

- 1. You must wear your ID card when on the range.
- 2. Maximum of 3 guests per member are allowed.
- Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
- 4. No Paintball guns
- 5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
- 7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
- 8. No digging in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 yards. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in
- 10. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 11. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
- 12. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
- 13. No human silhouette targets, except official police events.
- 14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
- 15. Do a **Safety Check** before firing
- 16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden
- 17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.
